Major Highways Programme

Balfour Beatty is working on behalf of Wokingham Borough Council on Wokingham's Major Highways Programme, to help facilitate growth in the borough of Wokingham. In meeting the council's responsibilities to deliver new housing, the borough is committing substantial investment, secured from the developers, in a wide range of infrastructure. This comprises of new schools, open spaces and leisure facilities, community facilities and roads, amounting to approx. £1billion investments in total.


The £124m Highways Programme delivered under the SCAPE Procurement Framework includes the Arborfield Cross Relief Road (ACRR), Barkham Bridge improvements, Winnersh Relief Road - Phase 2 (WRR), Lower Earley Way Dualling and three projects which form the South Wokingham Distributor Road (SWDR); Eastern Gateway, Spine Road and Western Gateway, The programme also includes the West of Old Forest Road, Toutley Road and Ashridge Farm sections of the North Wokingham Distributor Road (NWDR). These projects are being completed alongside residential developer-led projects which will later connect together to form the completed road.

Lower Earley Way Dualling

This project falls under the Wokingham Major Highways Programme. These works will involve widening of the road to provide two lanes in each direction, between the Loddon Roundabout (near Showcase Cinema) and the new junction with the Winnersh Relief Road. These dualling works are to accommodate the forecast traffic, which will be introduced by the completion of the Winnersh Relief Road (WRR).

We will realign the existing footway/cycleway and add a new footway to the eastern side of the road.






The works to deliver the Lower Earley Way dualling scheme will involve widening the northbound carriageway, including renewing the kerb, existing surface water drainage infrastructure, road markings, road signs and other street furniture. Finally, the road will be resurfaced throughout the entire limits of the scheme.

Detailed design started in Spring 2018 and enabling works are currently taking place to assess the site for accommodating the road dualling.

As part of the detailed design, a **Value Engineering** exercise was carried out. This has resulted in the reduction of the widening to the west side only. This has significantly improved the buildability of the scheme and has reduced the construction programme and costs whilst providing the required highway capacity and an improved pedestrian link between Hatch Farm and the Loddon Roundabout.
