#### 29. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

#### 30. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

Minutes of the meeting held on 5<sup>th</sup> September 2018 were approved as a true record and signed by the Chairman.

#### 31. <u>COMMUNITY & YOUTH CENTRES</u>

### 31.1 <u>Silverdale Centre</u>

The Town Clerk reported that the Music Fusion Project has proved to be successful with an average of 10-15 young people attending each week. They are writing and practising their own songs at the Music Fusion Youth Group, using instruments and equipment in the practice room and music studio, and will be performing some of their work at a gig to be held at the ReadiPop studio on 10<sup>th</sup> December 2018.

## 31.2 <u>Centrepoint</u>

The Town Clerk recently met with Sam Ruck who advised that the first session of the Youth Club to be held at Centrepoint would be on Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> November between 7.30 and 8.30pm. The target age range is 11-16 but this may be changed in the future depending on the numbers attending. Sam reported that 10 volunteers from local churches had been recruited. The first session had been quiet but successful. Posters advertising the group would be available soon.

#### 31.3 Radstock Lane Community Centre

The Town Clerk reported that the independent expert had submitted the Town Council's case for the determination of costs which would be conducted by the RICS appointed Arbitrator. It was noted that Wokingham Borough Council had agreed to pay the Arbitrator fees.
